Beavercreek High School Students Win 4th place at Academic WorldQuest

WHAT:

The four-student team from Beavercreek High School took 4th place at the national Academic WorldQuest (AWQ) competition in Washington, DC on Saturday April 2nd.

AWQ is a team game testing competitors' knowledge of international affairs, geography, history, & culture. Fifty high school student teams from public and private high schools grades 9 through 12 from 32 states came to Washington to compete in Academic WorldQuest.

Beating 46 other high school teams from around the country, the Beavercreek students each received a backpack with the Supreme Court insignia on it.
