## Maggie L. Walker Governor's School Students Win 5th place at Academic WorldQuest

### **WHAT:**

The four-student team from Maggie L. Walker Governor's School took 5th place at the national Academic WorldQuest (AWQ) competition in Washington, DC on Saturday April 2<sup>nd</sup>.

AWQ is a team game testing competitors' knowledge of international affairs, geography, history, & culture. Fifty high school student teams from public and private high schools grades 9 through 12 from 32 states came to Washington to compete in Academic WorldQuest.

Beating 45 other high school teams from around the country, the Governor's School students each received a ball point pen engraved with "Welcome to Airforce One" in a wooden case with the White House insignia on it.
